This week's major news updates in Pakistan's energy sector:

- Research shows that Sindh government's climate-related departments have only utilized half of the 48.8 billion rupees allocated for climate-resilient development in the past 16 years.
- The Power Division denies reports that the government is considering to change the net metering policy enacted in 2015.
- Islamabad adds more than 160 electric buses in its public transport fleet, connecting the city's main sectors with each other.
- Methane gas inhalation kills 12 miners working at a depth of 1,500 feet in coal mines in the Sanjdi area of Quetta.
